2010 “WING DING” RULES FOR CONTESTANTS

Contestants in UP Hog Wild 2009 who wish to participate in this year's “WING DING” must follow these guidelines. These rules have been established by UP Hog Wild, Inc. This is not a KCBS sanctioned competition.

1. There is no team limit. Any registered team who signs up for this event will be able to participate.
2. There will be a \$20.00 entry fee to compete in the UP Hog Wild 2010 “WING DING” Contest.
3. Chicken Wings will be donated by . Teams CAN NOT supply their own wings.
4. Each participating team will be provided with a “To Be Determined” number of pounds of whole chicken wings for preparation. 50 Pounds of wings will be evenly distributed between the number of teams that enter. However, the wings will need to be separated into drummies and paddles by the cooking team.
5. Wings must be barbequed and can not be deep fried.
6. Presentation or Appearance, Taste, and Creativity will all be factors in the judging.
7. After the cooks meeting, each team competing will be provided with a large numbered aluminum container.
8. 7:00 PM on Friday July 16th is the current posted turn in time. Final turn in time will be determined by UP Hog Wild. You will be notified of any change in this time when you register upon arrival.
9. Entries will be accepted five (5) minutes prior to, through five (5) minutes after the posted turn in time.
10. Competing teams will be asked to deliver their prepared wings in the numbered aluminum container to the designated turn in table at the judge's tent.
11. Only contest organizers will know the identity of each team's entry. Contest organizers will renumber the entries. The individuals selected to judge this competition will only know the food they taste by the NEW number located on the entry container.
12. Judges will be comprised of VIP's and Sponsors to UP Hog Wild 2010. They will be joined by members of the public who have won the right to participate through promotional contests.
13. Each judge will be given a “Ballot”. They will be asked to judge your entry based on three general categories. 1) Appearance (weighted .5714), 2) Taste (weighted 2.2858), and 3) Creativity in Preparation (weighted 1.1428). Each category will be judged using a number from 1 to 9. One (1) being lowest and Nine (9) being highest. Weighted multipliers will be used to determine a total score.
14. The wining teams will be selected from a tabulation of all valid scores. The team with the highest total score will win 50% of the entry fee prize pot. Second highest total score will win 33%, and third highest total score will win 17% of the entry fee prize pot. All entry fees will be returned to the top three teams with the highest total score.
15. Winners will be announced ring the awards presentation on Saturday afternoon.
